It was a blessing to see them receive new beds from the city, along with our church supplying food and gifts to them. We are praying that God will continue to work in the hearts of the family members.



Our church was able to have fellowships and special services throughout the months of December and January. The children were especially happy, since December is the beginning of their summer vacation time that lasts until March.

Continue to pray for those affected during the rainy season, which causes mudslides, flooding, and dangerous travel. February is the heaviest rain fall month.





The new year is well on its way, as many Peruvians try to find time for camps, VBS programs, vacations, and special meetings during these next two months. This month has been difficult, with four families in our church losing a loved one to death. It's not pleasant to have to direct funerals, but the Lord allowed us to minister to the families in their time of mourning.

Please pray for our church to be strengthened and unified in vision to expand. We continue to pray that God will provide land and leaders for the church. We ask for prayer for our VBS program February 15-18 and evangelistic meetings scheduled for March 24th-31st.
